

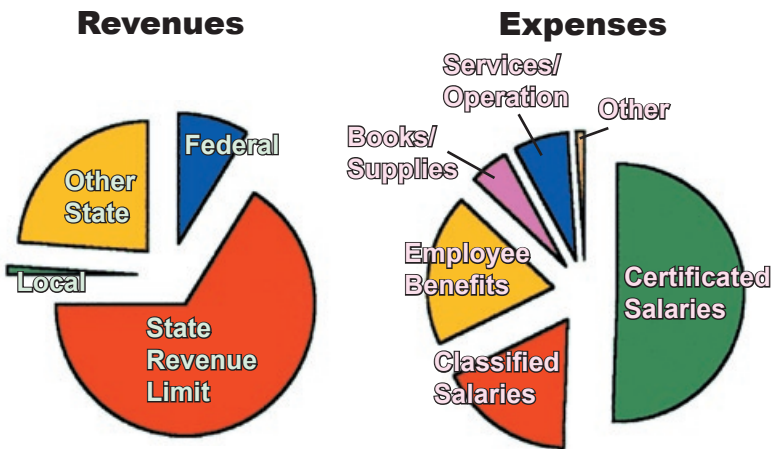

The Annual District Report Card provides an overview of the academic and financial status of Ukiah Unified. Students who attend schools in the Ukiah Unified School District experience a strong educational process that works to improve the opportunities for students to be successful and to achieve to the fullest extent possible. Staff members are dedicated to developing new programs that focus on the individual needs of students to promote student learning.

General Information

Students:

Ukiah Unified School District provides a strong and varied education for approximately 6000 students in grades K-12. The District maintains five preschools, seven elementary schools, two middle schools (grades 6-8), Ukiah High School (grades 9-12), South Valley Continuation High School (grades 10-12), and an Adult School serving 1500 adult students in day and evening classes.

Business Overview:

The District employs 822 people and manages a budget of \$65 million. To support the students' education, the District has multiple facets: transportation, maintenance, grounds, operations, custodial and food service.

Transportation:

The transportation program includes 30 buses running 75 routes, transporting almost 2500 students a day to and from school. Annually, the buses run nearly 500,000 miles.

Building Maintenance:

More than 125 buildings on 17 sites with acres of roofs, hundreds of heating/ventilating/air conditioning systems, miles of electrical circuits and plumbing systems are kept in good working order by 8 maintenance workers.

Grounds Maintenance:

District sites total nearly 200 acres, of which 55 are turf and grass with a portion devoted to plantings, shrubs, and trees. The grounds and all playground equipment are maintained by 6 groundskeepers.

Custodial Operations:

279 classrooms, 40 non-classroom spaces and 44 restrooms are cleaned daily by a staff of 33.

Food Services:

Forty-three workers serve more than 4500 lunches a day to students at 11 school sites throughout the District.

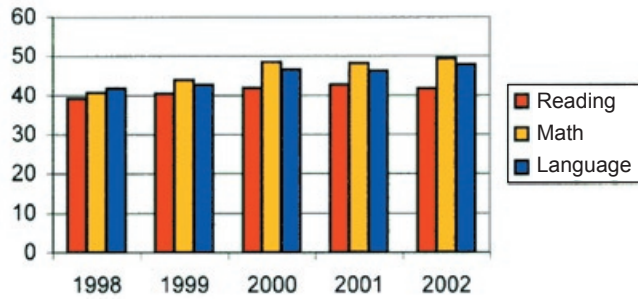
Mission

District Averages: Grades 2-11 Test Participation: 98%



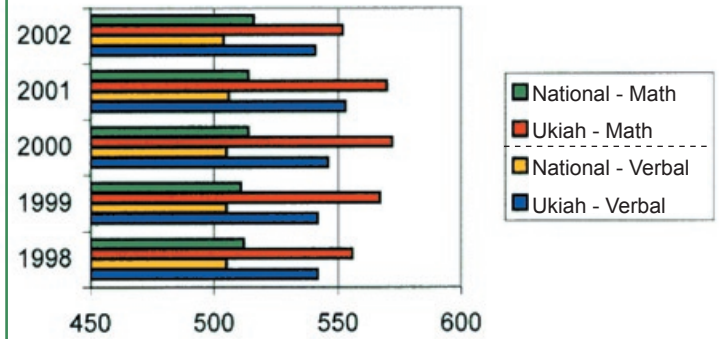
Above 50th Percentile: Subgroups

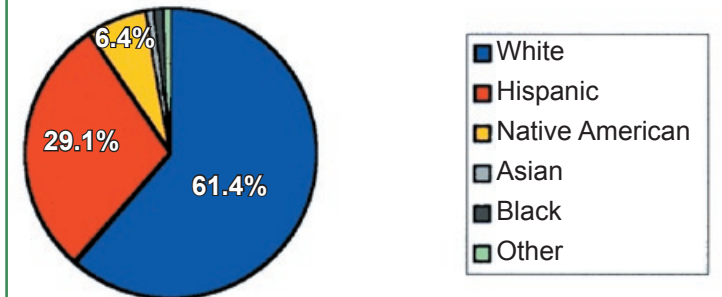

Staffing

Ukiah Unified School District's 822 employees makes it the second largest employer in Mendocino County. Almost half of these employees (394) are certificated teachers. To fill important teaching positions, the District has hired nine teachers with emergency credentials. It is also allowing three teachers to teach one period on a waiver, and one to teach outside his/her subject area of competence. All 48 managers, including District-level administrators, principals, assistant principals, deans, counselors and psychologists are fully credentialed, except one assistant principal who is working under an emergency credential in his/her subject area of competence.
